

Year 1 Maths Key Objectives

1	Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number
2	Count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals
3	Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (−) and equals (=) signs
4	Given a number, identify one more and one less
5	Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20
6	Add and subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20, including zero
7	Recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity
8	Recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.
9	Measure and begin to record length/height, weight/mass, capacity/volume & time
10	Recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes
11	Sequence events in chronological order using language
12	Recognise and use language relating to dates, including days of the week, weeks, months and years
13	Tell the time to the hour and half past the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times
14	Recognise and name common 2-D shapes (e.g. Square, circle, triangle)
15	Recognise and name common 3-D shapes (e.g. Cubes, cuboids, pyramids & spheres)

Year 1 Reading Key Objectives

1	Speedily read all 40+ letters/groups for 40+ phonemes
2	Read accurately by blending taught GPC
3	Read common exception words
4	Read common suffixes (-s, -es, -ing, -ed, etc.)
5	Read multi-syllable words containing taught GPCs
6	Read contractions and understanding use of apostrophe
7	Becoming very familiar with key stories, fairy stories and traditional tales, retelling them and considering their particular characteristics
8	Recognising and joining in with predictable phrases
9	Learning to appreciate rhymes and poems, and to recite some by heart
10	Drawing on what they already know or on background information and vocabulary provided by the teacher
11	Checking that the text makes sense to them as they read and correcting inaccurate reading
12	Discussing the significance of the title and events
13	Making inferences on the basis of what is being said and done

14	Predicting what might happen on the basis of what has been read so far
15	Explain clearly their understanding of what is read to them

Year 1 Writing Key Objectives

1	Spell words containing each of the 40+ phonemes taught
2	Spell common exception words
3	Spell the days of the week
4	Name the letters of the alphabet in order
5	Using the spelling rule for adding –s or –es as the plural marker for nouns and the third person singular marker for verbs
6	Using –ing, –ed, –er and –est where no change is needed in the spelling of root words
7	Sit correctly at a table, holding a pencil comfortably and correctly
8	Begin to form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place
9	Form capital letters
10	Form digits 0-9
11	Composing a sentence orally before writing it
12	Sequencing sentences to form short narratives
13	Read their writing aloud clearly enough to be heard by their peers and the teacher.
14	Leaving spaces between words
15	Joining words and joining clauses using "and"

Year 1 Science Key Objectives

1	Asking simple questions and recognising that they can be answered in different ways
2	Performing simple tests
3	Identifying and classifying
4	Identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees
5	Identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.
6	Distinguish between an object and the material from which it is made
7	Describe the simple physical properties of a variety of everyday materials
8	Observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.
