SCHOOL CROSSING PATROL UPDATE

Council chiefs have scrapped hugely controversial plans to axe funding for school crossing patrols. Staffordshire County Council had been looking to end support for its 248 lollipop patrols to save over £1 million, as part of its budget cuts. But following a major campaign led by parents to save the service - including a 7,000-name petition - council leaders have now decided to drop the plans from their final budget proposals. Thank you to all parents and Governors who supported this, ensuring that our children continue to remain safe on their journey to and from school each day.
